FROM OUR PRESIDENT RANDY STONE - 1121 RIVERSHYRE DR.



Happy Holidays everyone. Rivershyre looks very festive this year. I would like to commend all who took the time and effort to decorate their homes for the holidays. The neighborhood looks great.

The Board has reviewed and approved the Playground Project for installation near the clubhouse. This is the 1st phase of the clubhouse area master plan. The playground equipment (a wooden swing set and climbing fort/slide) will be installed in a 30' x 70' box filled with cedar mulch. It will be located between the tennis court and pool, but offset back behind the pool area fence line. Funding for the site work was authorized earlier this year as a part of the 2002 budget. The Social and Welcome Committee has accumulated enough from fund-raisers held during the last couple years to pay for the playground equipment. The detailed plans for the playground area have been submitted to the county to obtain a building permit. We are excited about finally getting this project off the ground and are hoping to get the playground completed in January or February. Mike Amerson has agreed to donate his time and equipment to do the site work, but we will need to get several neighborhood volunteers to help out with the equipment assembly and installation. The entrance fence that was damaged in a car accident has been repaired. We are looking into having the fence stained so the new boards will match. The Grounds and Lake Committee has previously researched fence coatings and has recommended a light gray stain that compliments the stonework columns and front entrance sign.

The split rail fence along Hardy McManus road will be taken down in the near future. Funds have been approved for replacing that split rail fence later this year. However, a suggestion has been made to remove the split rail fence and leave it down since all of the homeowners along Hardy McManus have installed privacy fences. Another suggestion was to plant some type of low maintenance shrubbery in lieu of a fence. The existing fence is severely deteriorated so we have decided to go ahead and remove the fence because it is an eyesore. This also gives us an opportunity to see what the entrance lawn area looks like without the fence and also consider various shrubbery options. We will be talking to the county extension agent and other plant experts to see if we can find suitable low maintenance plants that will provide an appealing continuity to our property line. In a few months, the board will decide whether or not to replace the split rail fence along Hary McManus. However, we would like to consider comments from the residents on this issue. We are not going to have a tree deposit area at the clubhouse this year. Last year we lucked out when Empire Tree Service agreed to grind up the trees for free. We were very grateful because they initially quoted \$350 to do that work. There are numerous places to recycle Christmas trees in our area: Rivershyre Middle School, County Government Complex, Home Depot, Kroger, and others have accepted trees in the past. Please take your trees to one of the authorized recycling areas so the community can avoid the cost of having to deal with it. Anyone "dumping" a tree at the clubhouse will be subject to the county fines if they are caught. I encourage anyone to call the Sheriffs Office at 541-2800 if they witness someone dumping their tree at the Clubhouse.
